*Nettie Calhoun Turner*

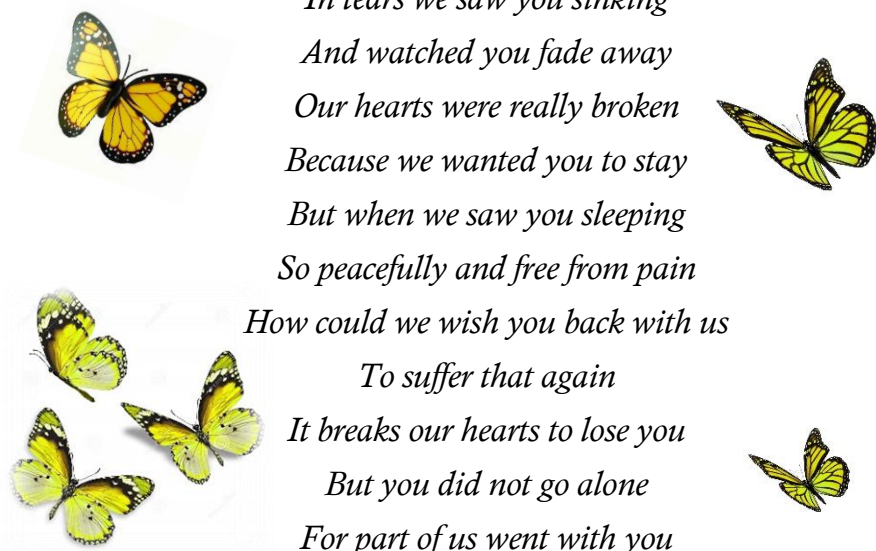
