Emma Lois Watts, 80, daughter of the late Ernest and Viola Shives Watts was born in Iredell County on August 28, 1940. She received her wings and transitioned from life to eternity on Monday, September 21, 2020 at Iredell Memorial Hospital, Statesville, after a brief illness. She was preceded in death by her brother, Ernest Alfred Watts, Jr, her parents, several other family members and recently her brother, Billy Watts.

Emma was a 1958 graduate of Morningside High School of Statesville NC. She also attended Johnson C. Smith University in Charlotte, NC. She was employed by and later retired from Carolina Mills.

Emma was also active in the civil rights movement. She and her brother, Billy Watts, participated in a sit in at Howard Johnsons restaurant counter on Aug 31, 1962 and were both arrested and put in jail. The anniversary of the protest was recently featured in the August 30, 2020 issue of the Statesville Record and Landmark.

At an early age, Emma joined Holsey Memorial CME Church where she was a junior stewardess and a junior usher. She continued to be actively involved in her church, serving as a member of the Missionary Society, the Senior Choir and the Shives Fellowship Choir. Her civic organizations included the Skyland Banner Elks Lodge and the Garfield Senior Citizens Club. She was an avid bowler and loved to read and travel.
