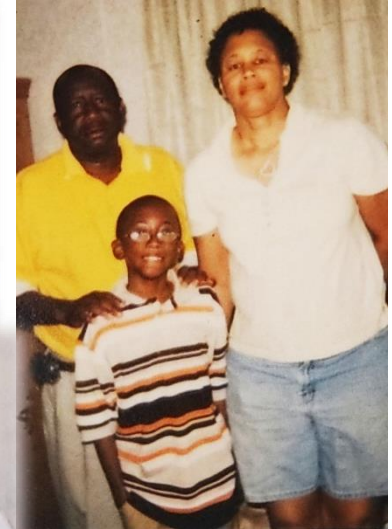

Mrs. Hattie Moize Mayberry Parker, 86, of 1661 Drumstand Road, Stony Point, N. C., was born in Iredell County, North Carolina on October 16, 1935 to the late Walter Pinkey Mayberry and Laruna Sharpe Mayberry. At age 12, her mother passed away and her father remarried the late Quay Mauney Mayberry.

At a young age, **Moize** gave her life to Christ, while a member of Zion Chapel A.M.E. Zion Church in Hiddenite, NC and was later baptized at Third Creek Baptist Church in Stony Point, NC. In 1954, she married the love of her life, Freddie Lee Parker, Sr., who preceded her in death after 40 years of marriage.
